

I am Jessica Hurst. I teach First Grade general education, Kindergarten, First, and Second Grade art, and Second Grade religion/sacrament prep. I also direct the Christmas and Drama Club plays. I graduated summa cum laude from Maryville University of St. Louis in 2006 with a BA in Elementary Education, with a concentration in social studies. In math, they will focus on basic addition and subtraction facts up to 18, understanding place value, measurement, telling time, calendar skills, number patterns, skip counting, and strategies for solving word problems, as well as recognizing geometric figures and fractions. Writing instruction will cover grammar concepts such as nouns, verbs, and adjectives, as well as constructing sentences, paragraphs, and various text types, including personal narratives, opinion pieces, informational texts, letters, and instructional how-to guides. Overall, the curriculum aims to build a strong foundation in reading, math, and writing skills.
